Semester 1 Reports

Semester 1 reports have been prepared by class teachers, ready to be sent home next Wednesday 29th June. These reports provide you with information about your child's progress and achievement for the year so far. Importantly, the reports will also provide you with information about your child's attitude, behaviour and effort – all key dispositions for successful learners.

In WA student achievement is reported on a five point scale for all years from Pre Primary to Year 10. For Pre Primary, Year 1 and Year 2 reports, student achievement is reported using achievement descriptors, without letter grades. From Years 3 – 6, letter grades and achievement descriptors are used.

The letter grades and descriptors are as follows:

- A the student demonstrates excellent achievement of what is expected for this year level
- **B** the student demonstrates **high** achievement of what is expected for this year level
- C the student demonstrates satisfactory achievement of what is expected for this year level
- **D** the student demonstrates **limited** achievement of what is expected for this year level
- E the student demonstrates very low achievement of what is expected for this year level

The assigned grades/descriptors are based on ongoing assessment of students undertaken by classroom teachers throughout Terms 1 and 2 with teachers making a professional judgement about each child's progress for this stage of the year.

Attitude, behaviour and effort are of particular importance and, as well as the general comments included at the end of the report, should be the focus of discussions you have with your child.
