
At Greenmount Primary School students are expected to:


- * be kind with their words and actions

Swimming





Swimming is low impact and undoubtedly a worthwhile exercise as no other sport or activity allows you to utilise as many muscles. Research indicates swimming is extremely good for your lungs, resulting in an improvement in your stamina and fitness.

Students from Pre-Primary to Year 6 will be receiving a swimming enrolment form shortly and a separate form is required for each student's enrolment. Swimming replaces Greenmount's Physical Education classes.

Our attendance numbers at Greenmount Primary have been outstanding. We appreciate your continued support in sending your child to swimming as it is such an important life skill for our children to have living in a country where swimming is a popular recreational activity.

For your child to attend swimming please ensure you fill in your child's details and return to the class teacher with payment. Lessons may be paid by cash, cheque, Eftpos facilities at the front office or via direct bank transfer BSB 016-359, account number 340879947 ensuring the reference reads NAME OF CHILD/ROOM NUMBER.

- · Cost per child is \$40.00.
- All forms and money to be in before swimming lessons Week 5, Tuesday 5 March.
- Lessons Tues 5th—Fri 15th March for two weeks every day at Swan Park Leisure Centre on the corner of Gray Drive and Morrison Road in Midvale.
- Slip on shoes/thongs can be worn to and from swimming. Only the first two groups may wear boardies to school as these groups are leaving early for lessons.
- Shoulder length hair should be tied back.
- No thongs are to be worn at school before and after lessons as the students can cause damage to their feet.
- · Don't forget to label bathers, hats, uniforms, all pieces of clothing, etc
- Students should have a change of clothes ready to put on at the pool after their lesson.
- Students should wear bathers under their uniforms ready to disrobe at the pool for their lesson
- Parents are more than welcome to attend and watch their child/children swim, but you will be charged entry.

Some timely reminders as we begin the new school year:

P&C News 6th February 2019

First of all I would like to say a huge thank you our Greenmount PS community for the support and all around love I have had from all of you over my past 4 years as President. I have loved every bit of it, but it is time to pass the reigns to someone else. And on that note, you are all invited to our AGM on the **26th of February** at 6.30pm in the Staff Room.

Who are and what is the Greenmount Primary School P&C?

The P&C is a wonderful opportunity for parents and carers to make a difference to their children's school environment and it is also a great way to meet others that care about the school community. We have achieved many fantastic projects over the years and is a vital link between the school and families.

Your participation can shape the place where your child will spend so much of their childhood. The P&C is made up of a diverse group of parents, grandparents and carers who lend their time, energy and skills to ensure Greenmount Primary School continues to provide a fantastic learning environment for our children.

The main role of the P&C is

- To give families an opportunity to learn about school policies and programs.
- Involve parents to shape the school community.
- Provide a voice for parents and students by maintaining a positive relationship between the families and the school administration.
- The P&C brings parents together to share information and views.
- Organise social events to build a strong sense of community.
- Raise funds to purchase additional resources for the benefit of our children (eg classroom materials, playground equipment).
- ♦ The P&C also run the Uniform Shop, Scholastic Book Club, Safety House Program, The Guardians of Greenmount (The Fathering Project) etc.

During 2018, the P&C have done some amazing things.

We have:

- Raised approx \$16 000 to use for the benefit of our children, some of which we used to purchase some sports uniforms (\$3480) for the seniors, purchasing some Maths Resources (\$1000), contributing \$1500 to putting together the Presentation Night at the end of the year.
- We also purchased an outdoor movie screen for future community events, and we also contributed approx \$1600 towards subsidising the Edu-Dance fees. We have kept some money aside to go towards some projects this year (details to follow soon).
- ♦ Scholastics Book Club sales garnered approx. \$2214 in credit for the school to use for class-room literacy resources.
- The Safety House Program has been maintained to help make kids aware of stranger danger and how to spot a safety house when they walk/ride between home and school by themselves.
- ♦ The Fathering Project (Guardians of Greenmount) held a number of great events over the year, which culminated in what will hopefully become the first many annual Camp Outs at school. Close to 50 Dads/Father figures attended with their kids.

Members of the P&C are ordinary, everyday parents, grandparents and carers that enjoy being part of a team. If you would like to come and join in the fun, we would love to see you. There are no expectations or skill set required, just a willingness to muck in and help out when you can.

The P&C meetings are held the 4th and 8th week of each term, on a Tuesday evening in the staff room. The first meeting of the year is the Annual General Meeting where nominations are collected for new office bearers, so if you want to come along and have a go at a position or just want to see what the P&C is all about please feel free to join us. Membership is a whopping 20c per year!

The P&C AGM will be held on **Tuesday 26th February 2019** at 6.30pm in the Staff Room. Please use the Service Entry and park on the basketball courts.
