Kiss and Drive

The Kiss and Drive is a designated drop off and pick up area only. For this area to work safely, parents and carers are reminded that there is no parking permitted on the path or in the Kiss and Drive zone.

This is particularly important in the afternoons when students begin coming out of school and getting into cars. Drivers are asked to move around 'the loop' so that cars behind can leave the Kiss and Drive zone when their children have been collected.

Some parents may need to drive through two or three times until their child arrives, however, it is essential that cars continue to move through for the safe running of the Kiss and Drive zone. Your patience and cooperation is appreciated.


