Our beautiful Xanthorrhoea at the entrance of the school is flowering. It can take over 20 years for a Xanthorrhoea to produce its first flowers. The flower is still quite small but could grow up to three metres long. When the flower is fully grown it will be covered in creamy-white flowers.
