Dear Greenmount families,

One of our key foci at Greenmount Primary School is to engage and challenge our students in their learning. As a staff, we have undertaken professional learning, shared strategies and implemented programs in classrooms to promote engagement in learning.

Around the school, it has been pleasing to see (and hear) students working together, focussed on the tasks that teachers have set for them, discussing strategies and expressing their understanding of what has been taught and learnt.

Some impactful strategies being used throughout the school include:

- Letters and Sounds—where junior students have been grouped and work together with a teacher or Education Assistant focussing on developing phonic knowledge and skills
- Paul Swan Maths—focussed on reinforcing key number facts and problem solving strategies
- Read Aloud
 – a strategy which ensures
 – students are exposed to quality texts and learn important comprehension skills
- Questioning—where teachers structure their questions to differentiate for varying skills
- Worked Examples—a strategy which provides students with examples of work at differing levels and supports their understanding of how they can work to improvement
- Brightpath Rulers—support students to understand the skills they have achieved in writing and what they need to do next
- Feedback
 – teaching students to receive and give constructive feedback about their learning and learning processes





Building on opportunities for students to give feedback, we recently invited a group of twenty students from Year 4 –6 to provide their thoughts and insights on the

results of a Student Survey completed last term.

These students were provided with the results of the survey, and in teams, they discussed the graphical representation of student responses to 10 questions.

What a pleasure it was to listen to the discussions and the very mature considerations they provided.

This same exercise last year provided us with some important understandings of what students in the school were thinking and feeling about school programs, friendships, and their teachers. Again, all staff will be able to discuss the students' reflections and the feedback these students provided will impact on our classroom planning and school processes.

Thank you to the students who contributed to this session—you did a great job!

are a key element of our school plans— and I look forward to working with another group of students soon.


